For \$700 you can book 10 private sessions at your loved one's crib or club—or the peaceful Orchid Pagoda in Fairfax. CIAO, ITALIA Surprise! You can put a Euro trip under the tree for your golf addict without damning your dear to tweeds and mediocre vittles.

Surrounded by gardens and woodland in the Fiesole hills of Florence, Villa San Michele is a former Franciscan monastery built in the 15th-century, with a facade that has been attributed to Michelangelo. A long list of starry guests have lived large in its antique-rich rooms, including Gwenyth Paltrow and Sting. Orient Express Hotels Group, the villa's parent company, customizes itineraries that feature four days and three nights of golfing, gastronomy, shopping and museums, as well as play time at Tuscany's leading courses: Golf Club Ugolino, the oldest and most prestigious; Le Pavoniere Golf and Country Club, designed by Arnold Palmer on land the Medici dukes used as a hunting reserve; and Poggio de Medici Golf Club, an 18-hole course and resort. Cooking classes, Prada and Gucci outlet shopping and other activities are planned for non-golfers. Similar golf excursions are also available through the famed Cipriani in Venice, also an Orient Express property. For \$1500, you can wrap up a pair of their super-chic genuine crocodile golf shoes with their ruddy color, shiny look and pure white soles. The rubberized spike sole is perfect for the grass, but can be worn in town as well. For the traditionalist, Walter Genuin's golf shoes, for men and women, are still handcrafted on the bench in Italy.
